# The most comprehensive research project on human values in Europe

#### The European Values Study project

The European Values Study (EVS) is a large-scale, cross-national, and longitudinal survey research program on basic human values. It provides insights into the ideas, beliefs, preferences, attitudes, values and opinions of citizens all over Europe. It is a unique research project on how Europeans think about life, family, work, religion, politics and society.

The European Values Study started in 1981, when a thousand citizens in the European Member States of that time were interviewed using standardized questionnaires. Every nine years, the survey is repeated in an increasing number of countries. The fourth wave in 2008 covers no less than 47 European countries/regions, from Iceland to Azerbaijan and from Portugal to Norway. In total, about 70,000 people in Europe are interviewed.

#### The EVS project in short

- Survey program with focus on a broad range of values: family, work. religion, politics, society, wellbeing

## Survey data

#### The data waves of the European Values Study

1981 - 1st EVS wave (16 countries) 1990 - 2nd EVS wave (29 countries)

1999 - 3rd EVS wave (33 countries)

2008 - 4th EVS wave (47 countries/regions)

2017 - 5th EVS wave (in preparation)

The data cover a whole generation: almost 30 years. In total, 125 surveys are administered in 49 countries/regions; 166,502 Europeans

answered questions in altogether 65 languages and language versions.

All data and documentation is downloadable free of charge. The EVS data files have been downloaded almost 18,000 times in the period 2006-2012 from GESIS Data Archive for the Social Sciences.


### **Publications**

More than 1,000 academic publications are realized based on EVS data. A large part of this literature is available through the EVS Repository which includes - next to biographical information - enhancements: information on which waves, countries and concepts (including variables and syntax codes) are used

The EVS book series is published by Brill (Leiden) and includes academic monographs and edited volumes. At this moment, the EVS book series covers 15 titles. A special volume in this series is the Atlas of European Values, which graphically illustrates the rich diversity in values and beliefs of the more than 800 million Europeans living inside and outside the European Union today.







## **Dissemination**

Beyond the academic world

The results of the European Values Study are disseminated in various ways to a broader audience than the academia.

For example, the EVS data are displayed in the United in Diversity exhibition in the Parlementarium, the visitor's centre of the European Parliament in Brussels.







In the EU funded project European Values Education, teaching materials for secondary education are developed in cooperation with Fontys University for Applied Sciences and other partners. The interactive website in seven languages www.atlasofeuropeanvalues.eu gives visitors the opportunity to create their own maps and graphs, to watch videos on youth in Europe, and to download teaching materials which can be used in the classroom.
